Epigraph

An epigraph is a short quotation or saying at the beginning of a literary text, in which it indicates the theme and/or sets the tone for the remainder of the text.

How to Use It : This rhetorical device can be utilized to support your argument, whether it be through the persuasion of opinion or factual evidence. To sustain your reasoning, epigraphs are more beneficial to the initiation of your argument and its application to the topic, itself.

EXAMPLE

The Great Gatsby

BY

F. SCOTT FITZGERALD

Then wear the gold hat, if that will move her; If you can bounce high, bounce for her too, Till she cry "Lover, gold-hatted, high-bouncing lover, I must have you!"

Anecdote

An anecdote can be defined as a short and interesting story or an amusing event, which is typically intended to evoke humorous emotions and make the audience or reader laugh.

This rhetorical device can be used to support your claim with the intention of bringing out emotion from your reader/audience (or pathos), which will more than likely persuade them to side with your argument.

This is a similarity between like features of two things, on which a comparison may be based.

Cacophony

The term refers to the use of words with sharp, harsh, hissing and unmelodious sounds primarily those of consonants to achieve desired results.

In literature, the unpleasantness of cacophony is utilized by writers to present dreadful or distasteful situations

Ambiguity

Doubtfulness or uncertainty meaning or intention. "Uncertain of a meaning leads into confusion"


Ambiguity is a word, phrase or statement that contains more than one meaning. It's a word or statement in which can lead to confusion. Based on the way it is viewed.

Example:

Nina went to the restroom in the park.

Nina literally can not actually use the restroom in the park, it confuses you. She cannot live without her heart.

She is talking about someone she really loves or her actual heart.

Antithesis

Antithesis: a person or thing that is the direct opposite of someone or something else.

Antithesis are two opposite ideas put together in a sentence to contrast an effect. An example would be that she say silver, but held out gold. It's contrasting her "saying silver" to "yells out gold". It's emphasizing that she was saying one thing but mean another. Or she acts like a very easy going person on the inside, but a hard person on the outside. It's saying how significant that one girl acts very hard just to cover up how she is very easy going in the inside.



Antithesis in an argument is the comparison of two situations or ideas, using this makes choosing the correct one simpler.
